## Working with Lusters

Things you will need:

Lusters Dilute for Lusters Plastic table cover (Lusters can ruin a table top) 91% Alcohol (Less oils in this percentage) Acetone Paper Towels 3 Clean small glass jars (Marked #1, #2, #3) Acrylic Brushes ( I get cheap ones from Michaels) Q-tips ( For wipe-outs) Comes in different sizes Pinstriping tape (If you need a sharp crisp line) Tweezers (Use to remove tape)

To start, I clean my area very well. Wipe your porcelain with 91% Alcohol, let dry completely. Apply your luster per direction.

To Clean Brushes:

Put acetone into 3 small jars Swish brush in jar #1 get out as much color as possible, wipe on paper towels. Do the same in jar #2 and than #3. Your brush should be clean and the acetone in jar #3 should still be clear.

Mark your brushes with the color you used (Example: Red, Green, Blue) Use that brush for the same type of color next time to avoid contamination of colors. If the brush is damaged or will not become clean just toss.

That is why I use cheap brushes instead of my expensive ones.
